

Genesis 9

King James Version (KJV)

9 And God blessed Noah and his sons, and said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth. (replenish – to populate again; it was inhabited before)

²And the fear of you and the dread of you shall be upon every beast of the earth, and upon every fowl of the air, upon all that moveth upon the earth, and upon all the fishes of the sea; into your hand are they delivered. (God gave them power over all other creatures. That doesn't mean that people have the right to abuse animals. God expects us to treat animals with respect)

³Every moving thing that liveth shall be meat for you; even as the green herb have I given you all things. (The health ordinances and clean food ordinances would be given to man later – through Moses)

⁴But flesh with the life thereof, which is the blood thereof, shall ye not eat. (Animals must be properly butchered and bled before consumption or the meats will putrefy – health laws. Never eat an animal's blood. Never eat the meat in the blood)

⁵And surely your blood of your lives will I require; at the hand of every beast will I require it, and at the hand of man; at the hand of every man's brother will I require the life of man. (Murder will be punished by execution)

(Also if an animal kills a person, that animal must be killed, or it will kill other people)

⁶Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed: for in the image of God made he man. (man = Eth-ha-Adam – the man – the 8th day creation; God demands capital punishment for premeditated murder)

NOTE: (On another level, Jesus was the man that was made in God's image. HE was God with us, in the flesh. The Kenites who engineered His crucifixion will pay with their lives; and that includes Satan) see Genesis-3:14-15

⁷And you, be ye fruitful, and multiply; bring forth abundantly in the earth, and multiply therein.

⁸ And God spake unto Noah, and to his sons with him, saying,

⁹ And I, behold, I establish my covenant with you, and with your seed after you; (Covenant = a contract, a promise)

(Through this lineage, Jesus would later come into the world, as Messiah. When God came to us as Jesus, He established a New Covenant – a new contract – the New Testament)

¹⁰ And with every living creature that is with you, of the fowl, of the cattle, and of every beast of the earth with you; from all that go out of the ark, to every beast of the earth.

¹¹ And I will establish my covenant with you, neither shall all flesh be cut off any more by the waters of a flood; neither shall there any more be a flood to destroy the earth. (A covenant is a contract- in this case, not to flood the world again. Noah's flood had flooded the lands of the 8th day creation. To them, it appeared to be the whole world)

NOTE: (The world-wide flood that ended the First Age was a world-wide flood. There were no survivors of that flood. It happened millions of years ago; possibly by a meteor or comet striking the oceans. We don't know exactly; but we do know that the earth has seen many mass extinction events)

¹² And God said, This is the token of the covenant which I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for perpetual generations:

¹³ I do set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be for a token of a covenant between me and the earth. (A rainbow for a seal to the contract between God and man)

¹⁴ And it shall come to pass, when I bring a cloud over the earth, that the bow shall be seen in the cloud: Isaiah-54:8-10 (God re-iterates His promise to man. Even as He will destroy this Age in the end days, He will not destroy man)

¹⁵ And I will remember my covenant, which is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall no more become a flood to destroy all flesh. (This flood had destroyed the 8th day creation – all except Noah's family. They brought it upon themselves when they mated with the fallen angels)

¹⁶ And the bow shall be in the cloud; and I will look upon it, that I may remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is upon the earth. (The rainbow serves as a reminder of our contract with God) See Isaiah-54:8-10

¹⁷ And God said unto Noah, This is the token of the covenant, which I have established between me and all flesh that is upon the earth.

¹⁸ And the sons of Noah, that went forth of the ark, were Shem, and Ham, and Japheth: and Ham is the father of Canaan. (Canaan would go on to become the patriarch of the Canaanite tribes. They later became heathen idol worshippers and sexual perverts)

¹⁹ These are the three sons of Noah: and of them was the whole earth overspread. (They were the majority of the local population, because they had not mixed with the fallen angels. Through their descendants, the Adamic people <the 8th day creation> would go on to spread all over the world)

(Some of their descendants would later become Israel, through Abraham's seed line. Over the centuries, they also mixed with the 6th day creation)

²⁰ And Noah began to be an husbandman, and he planted a vineyard:

²¹ And he drank of the wine, and was drunken; and he was uncovered within his tent.

²² And Ham, the father of Canaan, saw the nakedness of his father, and told his two brethren without. (Ham had an incestuous affair with his drunken mother – Noah's wife. He raped her while she was drunk)

See Leviticus-18:8 (To uncover your father's nakedness means to have sex with his wife)

See Leviticus-20:11 (This perversion carries the death penalty. It is incest)

²³ And Shem and Japheth took a garment, and laid it upon both their shoulders, and went backward, and covered the nakedness of their father; and their faces were backward, and they saw not their father's nakedness. (They were showing respect for their parents, so they walked backwards so that they wouldn't see. This also means that they didn't participate in Ham's perversion)

²⁴ And Noah awoke from his wine, and knew what his younger son had done unto him. (He was angry, and rightfully so)

²⁵ And he said, Cursed be Canaan; a servant of servants shall he be unto his brethren. (God didn't curse Canaan because he was innocent. Noah cursed Canaan. He was angry because Canaan's father was Ham. He raped Noah's wife to beget Canaan)

²⁶ And he said, Blessed be the LORD God of Shem; and Canaan shall be his servant.

²⁷ God shall enlarge Japheth, and he shall dwell in the tents of Shem; and Canaan shall be his servant.

NOTES: (Canaan's descendants <the Canaanites> would be the heathen people that again mixed with the fallen angels, when they returned. They were later mostly destroyed when God gave the Promised Land to Israel<Moses>)

(That's why the fallen angels will all die the instant that Jesus returns as Messiah, at the end of this Age. They brought that on themselves when they continually tried to sabotage God's plan; by mating with the flesh women of the 8th day creation)

²⁸ And Noah lived after the flood three hundred and fifty years.

²⁹ And all the days of Noah were nine hundred and fifty years: and he died.
