## 2 Corinthians 13 King James Version (KJV)

**13** This is the third time I am coming to you. In the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established.

<sup>2</sup>I told you before, and foretell you, as if I were present, the second time; and being absent now I write to them which heretofore have sinned, and to all other, that, if I come again, I will not spare: (Clean up your act and put out sin from you, or I will do it when I arrive)

NOTE: (Satan works through ignorant people today, in the same way. They call Christians bigots, because we don't condone sexual perversion or the other lusts of the world. They call it inclusion. God doesn't)

- <sup>3</sup>Since ye seek a proof of Christ speaking in me, which to you-ward is not weak, but is mighty in you.
- <sup>4</sup>For though he was crucified through weakness, yet he liveth by the power of God. For we also are weak in him, but we shall live with him by the power of God toward you. (Jesus was God in the flesh. HE lived humbly for our sakes. That doesn't make Him weak. Don't mistake humility for weakness. Jesus was humble, not weak)
- <sup>5</sup>Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates? (Look inward rather than accuse others. We all have faults. We all sin. Repent and get straight with God)
- <sup>6</sup>But I trust that ye shall know that we are not reprobates.
- <sup>7</sup>Now I pray to God that ye do no evil; not that we should appear approved, but that ye should do that which is honest, though we be as reprobates. (Look at us honestly and you will know that we have done no wrong. Stop listening to false rumors)
- <sup>8</sup> For we can do nothing against the truth, but for the truth. (The truth of God's Word never changes. You cannot re-interpret it in order to fit your agenda)

For we are glad, when we are weak, and ye are strong: and this also we wish, even your <u>perfection</u>. (perfection = spiritual maturity of your character; it doesn't mean like our word perfect. No one is perfect; but we can be mature in knowledge and wisdom)

<sup>10</sup>Therefore I write these things being absent, lest being present I should use sharpness, according to the power which the Lord hath given me to edification, and not to destruction. (God sent Paul to save them; not to destroy them)

<sup>11</sup>Finally, brethren, farewell. <u>Be perfect</u>, <u>be of good comfort</u>, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace shall be with you. (Be mature in your thinking) (God's Holy Spirit is the Comforter. Invite Him in)

(Stick to God's Word and ignore all other doctrines and preachers' "interpretations". God will reward you with peace of mind)

<sup>14</sup>The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Ghost, be with you all. Amen.
