King James Version (KJV)

- **66** Make a joyful noise unto God, all ye lands:
- <sup>2</sup> Sing forth the honour of his name: make his praise glorious.
- <sup>3</sup> Say unto God, How <u>terrible</u> art thou in thy works! through the greatness of thy power shall thine enemies submit themselves unto thee. (terrible= awesome or revered feared by His enemies only) (Revelation-15:3-4 <-> compare to 3-4 of this Psalm.)
- <sup>4</sup> All the earth shall worship thee, and shall sing unto thee; they shall sing to thy name. Selah.
- <sup>5</sup>Come and see the works of God: he is <u>terrible</u> in his doing toward the children of men. (terrible= awesome)
- <sup>6</sup>He turned the sea into dry land: <u>they went through the flood on foot</u>: there did we rejoice in him. <u>See Joshua-3:17 –crossing the Jordan</u>
- <sup>7</sup>He ruleth by his power for ever; his eyes behold the nations: let not the rebellious exalt themselves. Selah.
- <sup>8</sup>O bless our God, ye people, and make the voice of his praise to be heard:
- 9 Which holdeth our soul in life, and suffereth not our feet to be moved.
- <sup>10</sup> For thou, O God, hast <u>proved</u> us: thou hast <u>tried</u> us, as silver is tried. (proved= tested) (Tried- as metal is refined in the fire to remove impurities)
- <sup>11</sup>Thou broughtest us into the net; thou laidst affliction upon our loins. (They were snared in God's love, and worked hard to learn His word)
- <sup>12</sup>Thou hast caused men to ride over our heads; we went through fire and through water: but thou broughtest us out into a <u>wealthy place</u>. (first in bondage in Egypt, then through the wilderness, into the promised land) (wealthy place= a place of freedom)
- <sup>13</sup> I will go into thy house with burnt offerings: I will pay thee my vows,

- <sup>14</sup> Which my lips have uttered, and my mouth hath spoken, when I was in trouble.
- <sup>15</sup> I will offer unto thee burnt sacrifices of fatlings, with the <u>incense of rams</u>; I will offer bullocks with goats. Selah. (incense of rams-> rams not typically offered by the people, but rather by priests, princes or others of higher status)
- <sup>16</sup> Come and hear, all ye that <u>fear</u> God, and I will declare what he hath done for my soul. (fear= revere)
- <sup>17</sup>I cried unto him with my mouth, and he was extolled with my tongue. (Bad translation when I prayed to the Lord, I was so sure He heard that I already had a song of praise and thanks)
- <sup>18</sup> If I regard <u>iniquity</u> in my heart, the Lord will not hear me: (iniquity= vanity, usually idolatry)
- <sup>19</sup> But verily God hath heard me; he hath attended to the voice of my prayer.
- <sup>20</sup> Blessed be God, which hath not turned away my prayer, nor his mercy from me.
