Psalm 74 A Mas-chil of A-saph King James Version (KJV) Maschil= instruction

- **74** O God, why hast thou cast us off for ever? why doth thine anger smoke against the sheep of thy pasture? (Prophetically- When the enemy takes the Sanctuary – the tribulation of antichrist)
- ²Remember thy congregation, which thou hast purchased of old; the rod of thine inheritance, which thou hast redeemed; this mount Zion, wherein thou hast dwelt. (rod -> better translated - tribe)
- ³ Lift up thy feet unto the perpetual desolations; even all that the enemy hath done wickedly in the sanctuary. (When Jesus whipped the moneychangers in the temple, also see Daniel - When the desolator stands where he ought not) (Also today, Easter, a pagan orgy fertility ritual, replaced Passover)
- ⁴Thine enemies roar in the midst of thy congregations; they set up their ensigns for signs. (Teach doctrines of men – in Christian churches)
- ⁵ A man was famous according as he had lifted up axes upon the thick trees. (in the past, builders of the Temple were thought of highly)
- 6But now they break down the carved work thereof at once with axes and hammers. (but now, the builders are become destroyers)
- ⁷They have cast fire into thy sanctuary, they have defiled by casting down the dwelling place of thy name to the ground. (They have cast Your sanctuary into the fire – Alternate translation)
- *They said in their hearts, Let us destroy them together: they have burned up all the synagogues of God in the land. (You cannot negotiate with someone who is determined to destroy you)
- We see not our signs: there is no more any prophet: neither is there among us any that knoweth how long. (What the enemy say)
- 10 O God, how long shall the adversary <u>reproach</u>? shall the enemy blaspheme thy name for ever? (reproach= blaspheme or defy)
- 11 Why withdrawest thou thy hand, even thy right hand? pluck it out of thy bosom. (How long before God acts against the enemy)

- ¹² For God is my King <u>of old</u>, working salvation in the midst of the earth. (of old -> in the first age, and also can mean the deliverance from Egypt)
- ¹³ Thou didst divide the sea by thy strength: thou brakest the heads of the <u>dragons</u> in the waters. (dragons -> symbolic of the Egyptians, the Nile crocodile and also of Satan)
- ¹⁴Thou brakest the heads of leviathan in pieces, and gavest him to be meat to the people inhabiting the wilderness.
- ¹⁵Thou didst cleave the fountain and the flood: <u>thou driedst up mighty rivers</u>. Joshua-3:17 When they crossed the Jordan
- ¹⁶ The day is thine, the night also is thine: thou hast prepared the light and the sun. (Creation power of God)
- ¹⁷Thou hast set all the borders of the earth: thou hast made summer and winter.
- ¹⁸ Remember this, that the enemy hath reproached, O LORD, and that the foolish people have blasphemed thy name. (18-23 -> A prayer of Asaph)
- ¹⁹ O deliver not the soul of thy turtledove unto the multitude of the wicked: forget not the congregation of thy <u>poor</u> for ever. (poor=humble)
- ²⁰ Have respect unto the covenant: for the dark places of the earth are full of the habitations of cruelty.
- ²¹O let not the oppressed return ashamed: let the poor and needy praise thy name.
- ²² Arise, O God, plead thine own cause: remember how the foolish man reproacheth thee daily.
- ²³ Forget not the voice of thine enemies: the tumult of those that rise up against thee increaseth continually.
