King James Version (KJV)

- **31** In thee, O LORD, do I put my trust; let me never be ashamed: deliver me in thy righteousness.
- <sup>2</sup>Bow down thine ear to me; deliver me speedily: be thou my strong rock, for an house of defence to save me.
- <sup>3</sup> For thou art my rock and my fortress; therefore for thy name's sake lead me, and guide me.
- <sup>4</sup> Pull me out of the net that they have laid <u>privily</u> for me: for thou art my strength. (privily= secretly or covertly)
- <sup>5</sup> <u>Into thine hand I commit my spirit</u>: thou hast redeemed me, O LORD God of truth. See <u>Luke 23:46</u> also Jesus' last words.
- <sup>6</sup>I have hated them that regard lying vanities: but I trust in the LORD.
- <sup>7</sup>I will be glad and rejoice in thy mercy: for thou hast considered my trouble; thou hast known my soul in adversities;
- And hast not shut me up into the hand of the enemy: thou hast set my feet in a large room. (large room suggests freedom, not captivity)
- <sup>9</sup> Have mercy upon me, O LORD, for I am in trouble: mine eye is consumed with grief, yea, my soul and my belly.
- <sup>10</sup> For my life is spent with grief, and my years with sighing: my strength faileth because of mine iniquity, and my bones are consumed. (David refers to his adultery with Bathsheba)
- <sup>11</sup> I <u>was</u> a reproach among all mine enemies, but especially among my neighbours, and a fear to mine acquaintance: they that did see me without fled from me. (was= became)
- <sup>12</sup>I am forgotten as a dead man out of mind: I am like a broken vessel.
- <sup>13</sup> For I have heard the slander of many: fear was on every side: while they took counsel together against me, they devised to take away my <u>life</u>. (life= soul spiritual life)
- <sup>14</sup> But I trusted in thee, O LORD: I said, Thou art my God.

- <sup>15</sup> My times are in thy hand: deliver me from the hand of mine enemies, and from them that persecute me. (My times= my affairs)
- <sup>16</sup> Make thy face to shine upon thy servant: save me for thy mercies' sake. Numbers-6:24-26
- <sup>17</sup> Let me not be ashamed, O LORD; for I have called upon thee: let the wicked be ashamed, and let them be silent in the grave. (Let them be cut off for the grave better translation)
- <sup>18</sup> Let the lying lips be put to silence; which speak grievous things proudly and contemptuously against the righteous.
- <sup>19</sup>Oh how great is thy goodness, which thou hast laid up for them that <u>fear</u> thee; which thou hast wrought for them that trust in thee before the sons of men! (fear= revere)
- <sup>20</sup> Thou shalt hide them in the secret of thy presence from the pride of man: thou shalt keep them secretly in a <u>pavilion</u> from the strife of tongues. (pavilion= a temple, also can be a wedding tent see Rev-20:4-6)
- <sup>21</sup> Blessed be the LORD: for he hath shewed me his marvellous kindness in a strong city. (strong city= a fortified or fenced city)
- <sup>22</sup> For I said in my haste, I am cut off from before thine eyes: nevertheless thou heardest the voice of my supplications when I cried unto thee.
- <sup>23</sup> O love the LORD, all ye his saints: for the LORD preserveth the faithful, and plentifully <u>rewardeth the proud doer</u>. (proud to serve Godreward... proud of yourself– punishment)
- <sup>24</sup> Be of good courage, and he shall strengthen your heart, all ye that hope in the LORD.
