- <sup>10</sup> Trust not in oppression, and become not <u>vain</u> in robbery: if riches increase, set not your heart upon them. (vain= led astray) (When they return to Jerusalem, victorious, don't steal what belongs to others who are defeated)
- <sup>11</sup> God hath spoken once; twice have I heard this; that power belongeth unto God.
- <sup>12</sup> Also unto thee, O Lord, belongeth mercy: for thou renderest to every man according to his work. Rev-14:13
