Psalm 32 A Psalm of David, Mas-chil (giving instruction or King James Version (KJV) understanding)

- **32** Blessed is he whose <u>transgression</u> is forgiven, whose sin is covered. (transgression= rebellion, in thought or deed)
- ²Blessed is the man unto whom the LORD <u>imputeth</u> not iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no <u>quile</u>. (<u>imputeth</u>= <u>charge</u> with) (<u>quile</u>= <u>deceit</u>)
- ³ When I kept silence, my bones waxed old through my roaring all the day long. (Kept silence of my sins)
- ⁴ For day and night thy hand was heavy upon me: my <u>moisture</u> is turned into the drought of summer. Selah. (moisture= vigor)
- ⁵I acknowledge my sin unto thee, and mine iniquity have I not hid. I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the LORD; and thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin. Selah.
- ⁶ For this shall every one that is godly pray unto thee in a time <u>when</u> <u>thou mayest be found</u>: surely in the floods of great waters they shall not <u>come nigh</u> unto him. (When thou... see Deut-4:29) (come nigh= naga to lie with, as with a woman see Genesis-2)
- ⁷Thou art my hiding place; thou shalt preserve me from trouble; thou shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance. Selah.
- *I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: I will guide thee with mine eye. (God speaks to David)
- Be ye not as the horse, or as the mule, which have no understanding: whose mouth must be held in with bit and bridle, lest they come near unto thee. (Stubborn... must be dragged, or forced to go)
- ¹⁰ Many sorrows shall be to the wicked: but he that trusteth in the LORD, <u>mercy</u> shall compass him about. (<u>mercy= loving kindness, grace</u>)
- ¹¹Be glad in the LORD, and rejoice, ye righteous: and shout for joy, all ye that are upright in heart.
