

## Exodus 7

King James Version (KJV)

**7** And the LORD said unto Moses, See, I have made thee a god to Pharaoh: and Aaron thy brother shall be thy prophet. (Moses is a representative of God – better translation.)

(Pharaoh worships idols, so he will believe that Moses is neither a god nor a representative of God)

<sup>2</sup>Thou shalt speak all that I command thee: and Aaron thy brother shall speak unto Pharaoh, that he send the children of Israel out of his land.

<sup>3</sup>And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and multiply my signs and my wonders in the land of Egypt. (This is God's judgment on Egypt for abusing the Hebrews. They will be plagued ten times by God)

<sup>4</sup>But Pharaoh shall not hearken unto you, that I may lay my hand upon Egypt, and bring forth mine armies, and my people the children of Israel, out of the land of Egypt by great judgments. (God will use great miracles to show the people of Egypt that there is a God in heaven. That's why He hardened Pharaoh's heart. After this, Egypt and all of the surrounding nations will hear about Israel's God as well)

<sup>5</sup>And the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I stretch forth mine hand upon Egypt, and bring out the children of Israel from among them. (God wants to save all peoples, including the Egyptians. HE will see to it that they know Him and respect His Word. The same goes for the surrounding nations)

<sup>6</sup>And Moses and Aaron did as the LORD commanded them, so did they.

<sup>7</sup>And Moses was fourscore years old, and Aaron fourscore and three years old, when they spake unto Pharaoh. (80 years old; he spent 40 years in Egypt in Pharaoh's palace, and 40 years raising sheep in Median. He will spend the next 40 years getting the Israelites to the Promised Land)

<sup>8</sup>And the LORD spake unto Moses and unto Aaron, saying,

<sup>9</sup>When Pharaoh shall speak unto you, saying, Shew a miracle for you: then thou shalt say unto Aaron, Take thy rod, and cast it before Pharaoh, and it shall become a serpent.

<sup>10</sup> And Moses and Aaron went in unto Pharaoh, and they did so as the LORD had commanded: and Aaron cast down his rod before Pharaoh, and before his servants, and it became a serpent.

<sup>11</sup> Then Pharaoh also called the wise men and the sorcerers: now the magicians of Egypt, they also did in like manner with their enchantments.

<sup>12</sup> For they cast down every man his rod, and they became serpents: but Aaron's rod swallowed up their rods. (Showing that God would prevail over any evil)

NOTE: (In the end days, antichrist <Satan> will perform miracles in the sight of men; to deceive the world into worshipping him as god) see Revelation-13:11-17

<sup>13</sup> And he hardened Pharaoh's heart, that he hearkened not unto them; as the LORD had said.

<sup>14</sup> And the LORD said unto Moses, Pharaoh's heart is hardened, he refuseth to let the people go.

<sup>15</sup> Get thee unto Pharaoh in the morning; lo, he goeth out unto the water; and thou shalt stand by the river's brink against he come; and the rod which was turned to a serpent shalt thou take in thine hand.

<sup>16</sup> And thou shalt say unto him, The LORD God of the Hebrews hath sent me unto thee, saying, Let my people go, that they may serve me in the wilderness: and, behold, hitherto thou wouldest not hear.

<sup>17</sup> Thus saith the LORD, In this thou shalt know that I am the LORD: behold, I will smite with the rod that is in mine hand upon the waters which are in the river, and they shall be turned to blood. (The Egyptians had many gods, including a fish god. God is showing Pharaoh that He is the true God by polluting the water, which their fish god cannot protect)

Revelation-11:6 (The two witnesses will also do this miracle before antichrist so that people will know that there is a God in heaven. These miracles in Egypt are a way of waking people up, when the end times come. These miracles will be repeated for the same purpose at that time)

<sup>18</sup> And the fish that is in the river shall die, and the river shall stink; and the Egyptians shall lothe to drink of the water of the river. (The Egyptians called the Nile the "father of life" because their livelihood depended on the Nile for water to drink, as irrigation for farming, for fishing, even for transportation. They believed that it was protected by their fish god)

<sup>19</sup> And the LORD spake unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Take thy rod, and stretch out thine hand upon the waters of Egypt, upon their streams, upon their rivers, and upon their ponds, and upon all their pools of water, that they may become blood; and that there may be blood throughout all the land of Egypt, both in vessels of wood, and in vessels of stone. (Even the water that was stored in the homes turned to blood. This is proof of divine intervention)

<sup>20</sup> And Moses and Aaron did so, as the LORD commanded; and he lifted up the rod, and smote the waters that were in the river, in the sight of Pharaoh, and in the sight of his servants; and all the waters that were in the river were turned to blood.

<sup>21</sup> And the fish that was in the river died; and the river stank, and the Egyptians could not drink of the water of the river; and there was blood throughout all the land of Egypt.

<sup>22</sup> And the magicians of Egypt did so with their enchantments: and Pharaoh's heart was hardened, neither did he hearken unto them; as the LORD had said.

<sup>23</sup> And Pharaoh turned and went into his house, neither did he set his heart to this also.

<sup>24</sup> And all the Egyptians digged round about the river for water to drink; for they could not drink of the water of the river.

<sup>25</sup> And seven days were fulfilled, after that the LORD had smitten the river. (No water for 7 days – in the desert, this is a real problem)
