Numbers 31

King James Version (KJV)

- **31** And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,
- ² Avenge the children of Israel of the Midianites: afterward shalt thou be gathered unto thy people. (God gave Moses one last task before he dies)

(The Midianites made themselves enemies of Israel by seducing them into their religious idolatry through political subterfuge or deceit. They expected God to curse Israel for them, because Balaam would not do it. Don't try to play God. HE can out think any of us) See Chapter-25

- ³ And Moses spake unto the people, saying, Arm some of yourselves unto the war, and let them go against the Midianites, and <u>avenge</u> the LORD of Midian. (Judgment on Midian)
- ⁴Of every tribe a thousand, throughout all the tribes of Israel, shall ye send to the war. (12,000 men out of a 600,000 man army)
- ⁵So there were delivered out of the thousands of Israel, a thousand of every tribe, twelve thousand armed for war.
- ⁶ And Moses sent them to the war, a thousand of every tribe, them and Phinehas the son of Eleazar the priest, to the war, with the holy instruments, and <u>the trumpets</u> to blow in his hand. (The silver trumpets from Chapter-10)
- ⁷And they warred against the Midianites, as the LORD commanded Moses; and they slew all the males. (all of the adult males)
- ⁸ And they slew the kings of Midian, beside the rest of them that were slain; namely, Evi, and Rekem, and Zur, and Hur, and Reba, five kings of Midian: Balaam also the son of Beor they slew with the sword. (These are vassal kings under Sihon, the king of the Amorites. The Amorites were descendants of the fallen angels and their offspring, the Geber. Zur was the father of Cosbi, whom Phinehas slew with a javelin, for seducing an Israelite prince from one of the tribes. (Balaam was the man who was hired to cruse Israel. He just received what he deserved)
- ⁹ And the children of Israel took all the women of Midian captives, and their little ones, and took the spoil of all their cattle, and all their

flocks, and all their goods. (This land will eventually become part of Israel on the East side of the Jordan for Gad, Reuben and half of Manasseh)

- ¹⁰ And they burnt all their cities wherein they dwelt, and all their goodly castles, with fire. (The Midianites were nomadic and lived in tents. These castles belonged to the Moabites and the Amorites; their allies and fellow conspirators)
- ¹¹ And they took all the spoil, and all the prey, both of men and of beasts.
- ¹² And they brought the captives, and the prey, and the spoil, unto Moses, and Eleazar the priest, and unto the congregation of the children of Israel, unto the camp at the plains of Moab, which are by Jordan near Jericho.
- ¹³ And Moses, and Eleazar the priest, and all the princes of the congregation, went forth to meet them without the camp.
- ¹⁴ And Moses was wroth with the officers of the host, with the captains over thousands, and captains over hundreds, which came from the battle.
- ¹⁵ And Moses said unto them, Have ye saved all the women alive?
- ¹⁶ Behold, these caused the children of Israel, through the counsel of Balaam, to commit trespass against the LORD in the matter of Peor, and there was a plague among the congregation of the LORD. (They seduced and subverted Israel into sin and idolatry against God. Balaam couldn't curse Israel, but later worked for pay with Midianites to subvert Israel into idolatry; so that God would curse Israel for them)
- ¹⁷ Now therefore kill every male among the little ones, and kill every woman that hath known man by lying with him. (This would end the Midianites)
- ¹⁸ But all the women children, that have not known a man by lying with him, keep alive for yourselves. (The virgin females were kept alive. They would become servants)
- ¹⁹ And do ye abide without the camp seven days: whosoever hath killed any person, and whosoever hath touched any slain, purify both

- yourselves and your captives on the third day, and on the seventh day. (They were unclean)
- ²⁰ And purify all your raiment, and all that is made of skins, and all work of goats' hair, and all things made of wood.
- ²¹ And Eleazar the priest said unto the men of war which went to the battle, This is the ordinance of the law which the LORD commanded Moses;
- ²²Only the gold, and the silver, the <u>brass</u>, the iron, the tin, and the lead, (brass= copper bad translation)
- ²³ Every thing that may abide the fire, ye shall make it go through the fire, and it shall be clean: nevertheless it shall be purified with the water of separation: and all that abideth not the fire ye shall make go through the water. (All the spoil taken from the battle had to be purified before it could be brought into the camp)
- ²⁴ And ye shall wash your clothes on the seventh day, and ye shall be clean, and afterward ye shall come into the camp. Also see Ezekiel-44:25-26 (The Elect who help those who need help in the Millennium will require a 7 day cleansing before returning into God's presence)
- ²⁵ And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,
- ²⁶ Take the sum of the prey that was taken, both of man and of beast, thou, and Eleazar the priest, and the chief fathers of the congregation:
- ²⁷ And divide the prey into two parts; between them that took the war upon them, who went out to battle, and between all the congregation:
- ²⁸ And levy a tribute unto the LORD of the men of war which went out to battle: one soul of five hundred, both of the persons, and of the beeves, and of the asses, and of the sheep: (1/5 of 1% of that half for the Lord and for the priests)
- ²⁹ Take it of their half, and give it unto Eleazar the priest, for <u>an heave</u> <u>offering</u> of the LORD. (A thank offering to God for the victory)
- ³⁰ And of the children of Israel's half, thou shalt take one portion of fifty, of the persons, of the beeves, of the asses, and of the flocks, of all manner of beasts, and give them unto the Levites, which keep the charge of the tabernacle of the LORD. (2% of that half for the Levites)

- ³¹ And Moses and Eleazar the priest did as the LORD commanded Moses.
- ³² And the booty, being the rest of the prey which the men of war had caught, was six hundred thousand and seventy thousand and five thousand sheep, (675,000 sheep)
- ³³ And threescore and twelve thousand beeves, (72,000 cattle or oxen)
- ³⁴ And threescore and one thousand asses, (61,000 asses)
- ³⁵ And thirty and two thousand persons in all, of women that had not known man by lying with him. (32,000 women and girls)
- ³⁶ And the half, which was the portion of them that went out to war, was in number three hundred thousand and seven and thirty thousand and five hundred sheep:
- ³⁷ And the LORD'S tribute of the sheep was six hundred and threescore and fifteen.
- ³⁸ And the beeves were thirty and six thousand; of which the LORD'S tribute was threescore and twelve.
- ³⁹ And the asses were thirty thousand and five hundred; of which the LORD'S tribute was threescore and one. (Because asses were unclean animals, they were probably sold. The money went into the temple treasury)
- 40 And the persons were sixteen thousand; of which the LORD's tribute was thirty and two persons. (They became servants of the tabernacle)
- ⁴¹ And Moses gave the tribute, which was the LORD'S heave offering, unto Eleazar the priest, as the LORD commanded Moses.
- ⁴² And of the children of Israel's half, which Moses divided from the men that warred,
- ⁴³ (Now the half that pertained unto the congregation was three hundred thousand and thirty thousand and seven thousand and five hundred sheep,
- 44 And thirty and six thousand beeves,
- 45 And thirty thousand asses and five hundred,

- 46 And sixteen thousand persons;)
- ⁴⁷ Even of the children of Israel's half, Moses took one portion of fifty, both of man and of beast, and gave them unto the Levites, which kept the charge of the tabernacle of the LORD; as the LORD commanded Moses.
- ⁴⁸ And the officers which were over thousands of the host, the captains of thousands, and captains of hundreds, came near unto Moses:
- ⁴⁹ And they said unto Moses, Thy servants have taken the sum of the men of war which are under our charge, and there lacketh not one man of us. (There was not a single Israelite man killed in the battle. All 12,000 survived by the grace of God)
- We have therefore brought <u>an oblation</u> for the LORD, what every man hath gotten, of jewels of gold, chains, and bracelets, rings, earrings, and tablets, to make an atonement for our souls before the LORD. (an oblation = a voluntary offering to God)
- ⁵¹ And Moses and Eleazar the priest took the gold of them, even all wrought jewels. (Vessels of gold and jewels)
- 52 And all the gold of the offering that they offered up to the LORD, of the captains of thousands, and of the captains of hundreds, was sixteen thousand seven hundred and fifty shekels.
- ⁵³ (For the men of war had taken spoil, every man for himself.)
- ⁵⁴ And Moses and Eleazar the priest took the gold of the captains of thousands and of hundreds, and brought it into the tabernacle of the congregation, for a memorial for the children of Israel before the LORD.
