## Psalm 64 A Psalm of David

King James Version (KJV)

- **64** Hear my voice, O God, in my prayer: preserve my life from fear of the enemy.
- <sup>2</sup> Hide me from the secret counsel of the wicked; from the insurrection of the workers of iniquity: (Absalom's rebellion)
- <sup>3</sup> Who <u>whet</u> their tongue like a sword, and bend their bows to shoot their arrows, even <u>bitter</u> words: (whet= sharpen) (bitter= hurtful)
- <sup>4</sup>That they may shoot in secret at the <u>perfect</u>: suddenly do they shoot at him, and fear not. (perfect= upright, morally pious, mature)
- <sup>5</sup>They encourage themselves in an <u>evil matter</u>: they <u>commune</u> of laying snares privily; they say, Who shall see them? (evil matter= evil words, rumors) (commune= count)
- <sup>6</sup>They search out iniquities; they accomplish a <u>diligent search</u>: both the inward thought of every one of them, and the heart, is deep. (diligent search= deceitful tricks bad translation) (They search deep in their heart to deceive)
- <sup>7</sup>But God shall shoot at them with an arrow; suddenly shall they be wounded.
- \*So they shall make their own tongue to fall upon themselves: all that see them shall <u>flee away</u>. (their evil plots will become their own demise) (flee away= wag the head, ridicule)
- <sup>9</sup> And all men shall <u>fear</u>, and shall declare the work of God; for they shall wisely consider of his doing. (fear also means revere)
- <sup>10</sup> The righteous shall be glad in the LORD, and shall trust in him; and all the upright in heart shall glory.
