Hosea 5

King James Version (KJV)

5 Hear ye this, O priests; and hearken, ye house of Israel; and give ye ear, O house of the king; for judgment is toward you, because ye have been a snare on <u>Mizpah</u>, and a net spread upon <u>Tabor</u>. (Mizpah was a watch tower. Spiritually, it was for watching the Word of God. They turned it into a place of harlotry)

(Tabor was a mount of shrines to pagan gods. The snares and the nets are symbolic for being trapped by false doctrines)

- ²And the revolters are profound to make <u>slaughter</u>, though I have been a rebuker of them all. (This is the spiritual slaughter of souls by false teaching)
- ³I know Ephraim, and Israel is not hid from me: for now, O Ephraim, thou committest whoredom, and Israel is defiled. (They were not hidden then and they are not hidden now. God knows where the 10 tribes all are. They're not lost see the history of Europe, Canada and the US)

(After the captivity, the 10 northern tribes migrated over the Caucasus Mountains into Europe and later, North America. They became known as Caucasians)

⁴They will not frame their doings to turn unto their God: for the spirit of whoredoms is in the midst of them, and they have not known the LORD. (All they know is idolatry. They have completely taken God out of their lives)

(Today, how many Christian churches teach the Bible chapter by chapter, verse by verse? Almost none of them do. Instead they preach sermons written by men. The people learn nothing of God's Word)

- ⁵And the pride of Israel doth testify to his face: therefore shall Israel and Ephraim fall in their iniquity: Judah also shall fall with them. (Judgment for their evil deeds towards God) (Judah fell to captivity 200 years after Israel did)
- They shall go with their flocks and with their herds to seek the LORD; but they shall not find him; he hath withdrawn himself from them. (They abandoned God so He withdrew from them. They did it to themselves)

They have dealt treacherously against the LORD: <u>for they have</u> <u>begotten strange children</u>: now shall a month devour them with their portions. (They will go down quickly)

(They have mixed with the heathen tribes around them. God told them not to do that)

- *Blow ye the cornet in Gibeah, and the trumpet in Ramah: cry aloud at Bethaven, after thee, O Benjamin. (If the Assyrian is in Benjamin, then the 10 northern tribes have already fallen)
- ⁹ Ephraim shall be desolate in the day of rebuke: among the tribes of Israel have I made known that which shall surely be. (Not maybe)
- ¹⁰ The princes of Judah were like them that <u>remove the bound</u>: therefore I will pour out my wrath upon them like water. (Remove the bound remove the boundaries. They lose all knowledge of who they are and who God is. They become as the heathen tribes)
- ¹¹ Ephraim is oppressed and broken in judgment, because he willingly walked <u>after the commandment</u>. (The false commandment of false teachings; not God's commandments) Deuteronomy-28:33-44
- ¹²Therefore will I be unto Ephraim <u>as a moth</u>, and to the house of Judah as rottenness. (Destruction from within)
- ¹³ When Ephraim saw his sickness, and Judah saw his wound, <u>then</u> <u>went Ephraim to the Assyrian</u>, and sent to king Jareb: yet could he not heal you, nor cure you of your wound. (The Assyrian is the enemy. He is also used as a type for Satan in the end days of this Age)

(You don't go to the enemy to be healed. It's a losing strategy)

- ¹⁴ For <u>I will be unto Ephraim as a lion</u>, and as a young lion to the house of Judah: I, even I, will tear and go away; I will take away, and none shall rescue him. (God will tear them up like a lion does to its prey) (Judah won't escape either)
- ¹⁵ I will go and return to my place, till they acknowledge their offence, and seek my face: in their affliction they will seek me early. (They will hurt until they repent and get right with God. Only then will He forgive them and take them back)
