## Psalm 106

King James Version (KJV)

- **106** Praise ye the LORD. O give thanks unto the LORD; for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever. (Praise ye the LORD- Hallelujah, in the Hebrew)
- <sup>2</sup>Who can utter the mighty acts of the LORD? who can shew forth all his praise? (There is no end to God's goodness)
- <sup>3</sup> Blessed are they that keep judgment, and he that doeth righteousness at all times.
- <sup>4</sup>Remember me, O LORD, with the favour that thou bearest unto thy people: O visit me with thy salvation;
- <sup>5</sup>That I may see the good of thy chosen, that I may rejoice in the gladness of thy nation, that I may glory with thine inheritance.
- <sup>6</sup> We have sinned with our fathers, we have committed iniquity, we have done wickedly.
- <sup>7</sup>Our fathers understood not thy wonders in Egypt; they remembered not the multitude of thy mercies; but provoked him at the sea, even at the Red sea. Exodus-14:11
- <sup>8</sup> Nevertheless he saved them for his name's sake, that he might make his mighty power to be known. (Moses interceded for the foolish Israelites)
- <sup>9</sup>He rebuked the Red sea also, and it was dried up: so he led them through the depths, as through the wilderness.
- <sup>10</sup> And he saved them from the hand of him that hated them, and <u>redeemed</u> them from the hand of the enemy. (as a kinsman redeemer does)
- <sup>11</sup> And the waters covered their enemies: there was not one of them left. (God destroyed the whole army. Only Pharaoh, survived because he had not entered)
- <sup>12</sup>Then believed they his words; they sang his praise. (For a short time)

- <sup>13</sup> They soon forgat his works; they waited not for his counsel: (They quickly turned away from God, despite all the miracles He had performed for them)
- <sup>14</sup> But lusted exceedingly in the wilderness, and tempted God in the desert. (Ten major times until God finally condemned that generation to not enter the Promised Land)
- <sup>15</sup> And he gave them their request; but sent leanness into their soul. (They weren't satisfied with manna, they lusted for meat. He gave them quail)
- <sup>16</sup> They envied Moses also in the camp, and Aaron the saint of the LORD. (Attempted subversion of Moses' God given authority)
- <sup>17</sup> The earth opened and swallowed up Dathan and covered the company of Abiram. (God ended the rebellion of Korah Dathan and Abiram were his followers.)
- <sup>18</sup> And a fire was kindled in their company; the flame burned up the wicked. (The fakes tried to offer incense to God. Only the true priests were allowed to do that.)
- <sup>19</sup>They made a calf in Horeb, and worshipped the molten image. (When God was giving them the 10 Commandments, they were idol worshipping) (Horeb is the mountain range where Sinai is located)
- <sup>20</sup> Thus they changed <u>their</u> glory into the similitude of an ox that eateth grass. (This verse was changed their should be MY)
- <sup>21</sup> They forgat God their saviour, which had done great things in Egypt;
- <sup>22</sup> Wondrous works in the land of Ham, and <u>terrible</u> things by the Red sea. (terrible- awesome)
- <sup>23</sup> Therefore he said that he would destroy them, had not Moses his chosen stood before him in the breach, to turn away his wrath, lest he should destroy them. Exodus-32:10
- <sup>24</sup> Yea, they despised the pleasant land, they believed not his word: (They refused to enter into the Promised Land, when God wanted them to)

- <sup>25</sup> But murmured in their tents, and hearkened not unto the voice of the LORD. (They had no faith in God) (They actually wanted to return into bondage in Egypt)
- <sup>26</sup>Therefore he lifted up his hand against them, to overthrow them in the wilderness:
- <sup>27</sup>To <u>overthrow</u> their seed also among the nations, and to scatter them in the lands. (overthrow- disperse -> in the Septuagint) (Even today, most descendents of the 10 tribes think they are gentiles)
- <sup>28</sup> They joined themselves also unto Baalpeor, and ate the sacrifices of the dead. Numbers-25 (They worshipped and sacrificed to the god of the Moabites) (Moses was furious)
- <sup>29</sup> Thus they provoked him to anger with their inventions: and the plague brake in upon them. Numbers-25:9
- <sup>30</sup> Then stood up Phinehas, and executed judgment: and so the plague was stayed.
- <sup>31</sup> And that was counted unto him for righteousness unto all generations for evermore. (He was promised that the high priesthood would remain in his seed line)
- <sup>32</sup>They angered him also at the waters of strife, so that it went ill with Moses for their sakes: (Moses sinned at the waters of Mira bah) Exodus-20
- <sup>33</sup> Because they provoked his spirit, so that he <u>spake unadvisedly</u> with his lips. (spake unadvisedly-babble in anger)
- <sup>34</sup> They did not destroy the nations, concerning whom the LORD commanded them: (Joshua didn't destroy all The Canaanites)
- <sup>35</sup> But were mingled among the heathen, and learned their works. (They intermarried with the Canaanites and took on their false gods)
- <sup>36</sup> And they served their idols: which were a snare unto them. (Just as God had warned them)
- <sup>37</sup> Yea, they sacrificed their sons and their daughters unto devils, Deuteronomy-32:17

- <sup>38</sup> And shed innocent blood, even the blood of their sons and of their daughters, whom they sacrificed unto the idols of Canaan: and the land was polluted with blood. (An abomination to God)
- <sup>39</sup> Thus were they defiled with their own works, and went a whoring with their own inventions. (God sees idolatry as whoring)
- ⁴ Therefore was the wrath of the LORD kindled against his people, insomuch that he abhorred his own inheritance.
- <sup>41</sup> And he gave them into the hand of the heathen; and they that hated them ruled over them. (They received what they had earned)
- <sup>42</sup> Their enemies also oppressed them, and they were brought into subjection under their hand. See Judges (God saved them continually, but the always abandoned Him afterwards)
- 43 Many times did he deliver them; but they provoked him with their counsel, and were brought low for their iniquity.
- <sup>⁴⁴</sup> Nevertheless he regarded their affliction, when he heard their cry:
- <sup>45</sup> And he remembered for them his covenant, and repented according to the multitude of his mercies.
- <sup>46</sup> He made them also to be pitied of all those that carried them captives.
- <sup>47</sup> Save us, O LORD our God, and gather us from among the heathen, to give thanks unto thy holy name, and to triumph in thy praise.
- 48 Blessed be the LORD God of Israel from everlasting to everlasting: and let all the people say, Amen. Praise ye the LORD. (Praise ye the LORD- Hallelujah, in the Hebrew)
