## **Psalm 35** A Psalm of David – In view of Psalm 22 King James Version (KJV)

- **35** <u>Plead</u> *my cause*, O LORD, with them that strive with me: fight against them that fight against me. (Plead= contend, fight) (my cause-> added by the translators)
- <sup>2</sup>Take hold of shield and buckler, and stand up for mine help.
- <sup>3</sup>Draw out also the spear, and stop the way against them that persecute me: say unto my soul, I am thy salvation.
- <sup>4</sup>Let them be confounded and put to shame that seek after my soul: let them be turned back and brought to confusion that devise my hurt.
- <sup>5</sup>Let them be as chaff before the wind: and let the angel of the LORD chase them.
- <sup>6</sup>Let their way be dark and slippery: and let the angel of the LORD persecute them.
- <sup>7</sup> For without cause have they hid for me their net in a pit, which without cause they have digged for my soul.
- <sup>8</sup>Let destruction come upon him at unawares; and let his net that he hath hid catch himself: into that very destruction let him fall.
- <sup>9</sup> And my soul shall be joyful in the LORD: it shall rejoice in his salvation.
- <sup>10</sup> All my bones shall say, LORD, who is like unto thee, which deliverest the <u>poor</u> from him that is too strong for him, yea, the <u>poor</u> and the needy from him that spoileth him? (poor= meek, humble)
- <sup>11</sup> False witnesses did rise up; they laid to my charge things that I knew not. (Common for Christians to be falsely accused David, Jesus, and later, the elect)
- <sup>12</sup>They rewarded me evil for good to the spoiling of my soul.
- <sup>13</sup> But as for me, when they were sick, my clothing was sackcloth: I humbled my soul with fasting; and my prayer returned into mine own bosom.

- <sup>14</sup>I behaved myself as though he had been my friend or brother: I bowed down heavily, <u>as one that mourneth for his mother</u>. (he -> the same as They in verse 12) (as one... bad translation -> as a mother mourns for her dead child)
- <sup>15</sup> But in mine adversity <u>they</u> rejoiced, and gathered themselves together: yea, the <u>abjects</u> gathered themselves together against me, and I knew it not; they did tear me, and ceased not: (they-> Kenites) (abjects= the dregs of mankind)
- <sup>16</sup> With <u>hypocritical</u> mockers in <u>feasts</u>, they gnashed upon me with their teeth. (hypocritical= stage actors) (feasts= cakes of bread)
- <sup>17</sup>Lord, how long wilt thou look on? rescue my soul from their destructions, my <u>darling</u> from the lions. (darling = soul, my only one)
- <sup>18</sup> I will give thee thanks in the great congregation: I will praise thee among much people. Same as in Psalm 22
- <sup>19</sup> Let not them that are mine enemies wrongfully rejoice over me: neither let them wink with the eye that hate me without a cause. (wink with the eye -> to mock someone) (hate.. see John-15:25)
- <sup>20</sup> For they speak not peace: but they devise deceitful matters against them that are quiet in the land. (quiet= peaceful, praising God)
- <sup>21</sup> Yea, they opened their mouth wide against me, and said, Aha, aha, our eye hath seen it. (false witnesses against Jesus)
- <sup>22</sup>This thou hast seen, O LORD: keep not silence: O Lord, be not far from me.
- <sup>23</sup> Stir up thyself, and awake to my judgment, even unto my cause, my God and my Lord.
- <sup>24</sup> Judge me, O LORD my God, according to thy righteousness; and let them not rejoice over me.
- <sup>25</sup>Let them not say in their hearts, Ah, so would we have it: let them not say, We have swallowed him up. (They didn't win. Jesus defeated death at the resurrection)

<sup>26</sup> Let them be ashamed and brought to confusion together that rejoice at mine hurt: let them be clothed with shame and dishonour that magnify themselves against me. (confusion -> babyl, in prophesy)

<sup>27</sup> Let them shout for joy, and be glad, that favour my righteous cause: yea, let them say continually, Let the LORD be magnified, which hath pleasure in the <u>prosperity</u> of his servant. (Those that serve Christ – they know God wins) (prosperity-> not necessarily earthly wealth – more likely contentment, peace of mind, happiness)

<sup>28</sup> And my tongue shall speak of thy righteousness and of thy praise all the day long.
