

## Genesis 12

King James Version (KJV)

**12** Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee: (God sent Abram from Ur into the land of Canaan)

<sup>2</sup>And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing: (God blessed Abraham, because Abraham loved and obeyed God throughout his whole life)

<sup>3</sup>And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed. (Abraham, through Isaac & Jacob would bring forth the 12 tribes of Israel. Jesus would come through this seed line and bless all people who believe on Him. That's why we are all blessed through Abraham)

<sup>4</sup>So Abram departed, as the LORD had spoken unto him; and Lot went with him: and Abram was seventy and five years old when he departed out of Haran. (Abram always obeyed and loved God)

<sup>5</sup>And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Canaan they came. (The Land of Canaan was inhabited by the descendants of Ham's son, Canaan)

(They had become heathen peoples. They mixed <mated> with the fallen angels to produce more Giber – giant hybrid offspring. They also took part in sexual perversion and human sacrifice)

<sup>6</sup>And Abram passed through the land unto the place of Sichem, unto the plain of Moreh. And the Canaanite was then in the land.

<sup>7</sup>And the LORD appeared unto Abram, and said, Unto thy seed will I give this land: and there builded he an altar unto the LORD, who appeared unto him. (God judged the Canaanites for their sins. HE gave their land to Abraham and his descendants – the 12 tribes of Israel, under Jacob)

<sup>8</sup>And he removed from thence unto a mountain on the east of Bethel, and pitched his tent, having Bethel on the west, and Hai on the east:

and there he builded an altar unto the LORD, and called upon the name of the LORD. (Bethel = house of God; Hai = a heap, a waste)

<sup>9</sup>And Abram journeyed, going on still toward the south.

<sup>10</sup>And there was a famine in the land: and Abram went down into Egypt to sojourn there; for the famine was grievous in the land. (Egypt depended on the Nile for water and for farming. Therefore they didn't suffer from the drought as other nations did)

<sup>11</sup>And it came to pass, when he was come near to enter into Egypt, that he said unto Sarai his wife, Behold now, I know that thou art a fair woman to look upon: (Sarai was a beautiful woman)

<sup>12</sup>Therefore it shall come to pass, when the Egyptians shall see thee, that they shall say, This is his wife: and they will kill me, but they will save thee alive. (Abram knew he couldn't fight off a king and his entire army. He knew that he could trust Sarai to be faithful to him)

<sup>13</sup>Say, I pray thee, thou art my sister: that it may be well with me for thy sake; and my soul shall live because of thee. (She actually was his half-sister, as well as his wife)

<sup>14</sup>And it came to pass, that, when Abram was come into Egypt, the Egyptians beheld the woman that she was very fair.

<sup>15</sup>The princes also of Pharaoh saw her, and commended her before Pharaoh: and the woman was taken into Pharaoh's house. (Just as Abram had predicted. Had he tried to fight back against pharaoh and his army, he would have been killed. He trusted Sarai not to cheat on him)

<sup>16</sup>And he entreated Abram well for her sake: and he had sheep, and oxen, and he asses, and menservants, and maidservants, and she asses, and camels. (Pharaoh gave Abram riches, so that he could have Sarai)

<sup>17</sup>And the LORD plagued Pharaoh and his house with great plagues because of Sarai Abram's wife. (God takes care of His own)

<sup>18</sup>And Pharaoh called Abram and said, What is this that thou hast done unto me? why didst thou not tell me that she was thy wife? (Pharaoh was not a bad man. He would not have taken Sarai if he had known that she was Abram's wife. He will release them both, unharmed)

<sup>19</sup> Why saidst thou, She is my sister? so I might have taken her to me to wife: now therefore behold thy wife, take her, and go thy way. (This was God's way of saving the lives of Abram and Sarai; while blessing them with riches from Pharaoh's treasury)

<sup>20</sup> And Pharaoh commanded his men concerning him: and they sent him away, and his wife, and all that he had. (Abram left Egypt, a rich man. God saved them through the drought and made them rich in the process)
