A Psalm of David, when he changed his behavior before A-keesh: who drove him away, and he departed

King James Version (KJV)

- **34** I will bless the LORD at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth.
- ²My soul shall make her <u>boast</u> in the LORD: the humble shall hear thereof, and be glad. (boast= celebrate)
- ³O magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together.
- ⁴I sought the LORD, and he heard me, and delivered me from all my fears.
- ⁵They looked unto him, and were <u>lightened</u>: and their faces were not ashamed. (<u>lightened</u> their burdens were <u>lightened</u>)
- ⁶This <u>poor</u> man cried, and the LORD heard him, and saved him out of all his troubles. (poor= humble)
- ⁷The angel of the LORD encampeth round about them that <u>fear</u> him, and delivereth them. (fear= revere)
- O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him. Ezekiel-3
- °O fear the LORD, ye his saints: for there is no want to them that fear him. Psalm-23
- ¹⁰ The young lions do lack, and suffer hunger: but they that seek the LORD shall not want any good thing.
- ¹¹ Come, ye children, hearken unto me: I will teach you the <u>fear</u> of the LORD. (fear= reverence) Proverbs-1:7
- ¹² What man is he that desireth life, and loveth many days, that he may see good?
- ¹³ Keep thy tongue from evil, and thy lips from speaking guile.
- ¹⁴ Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it.

- ¹⁵ The eyes of the LORD are upon the righteous, and his ears are open unto their cry.
- ¹⁶ The face of the LORD is against them that do evil, to cut off the remembrance of them from the earth. (first P, in the Hebrew)
- ¹⁷ The righteous cry, and the LORD heareth, and delivereth them out of all their troubles.
- ¹⁸ The LORD is <u>nigh</u> unto them that are of a <u>broken heart</u>; and saveth such as be of a <u>contrite spirit</u>. (nigh= close by, ready to help) (broken heart -> someone who has sinned) (contrite spirit -> repentant)
- ¹⁹ Many are the afflictions of the righteous: but the LORD delivereth him out of them all. (Afflictions brought on by Satan or by us. God allows it to toughen us and to test us.)
- ²⁰ He keepeth all his bones: not one of them is broken. (This refers to Jesus) See John-19:36, Ex-12:46
- ²¹ Evil shall slay the wicked: and they that hate the righteous shall be desolate.
- ²²The LORD redeemeth the soul of his servants: and none of them that trust in him shall be desolate. (second P, in the Hebrew)
