

Isaiah 63

King James Version (KJV)

(Messiah in person, in judgment)

63 Who is this that cometh from Edom, with dyed garments from Bozrah? this that is glorious in his apparel, travelling in the greatness of his strength? I that speak in righteousness, mighty to save. (Edom = red) (Bozrah = fortress; the prime root is sheep cote or wine press)

(These are analogies as to why His apparel is all red)

²Wherefore art thou red in thine apparel, and thy garments like him that treadeth in the winefat? (HIS garments are red from warring against the wicked ones at the Second Advent)

³I have trodden the winepress alone; and of the people there was none with me: for I will tread them in mine anger, and trample them in my fury; and their blood shall be sprinkled upon my garments, and I will stain all my raiment. (This is judgment day, when Messiah returns)

(His wrath is poured out on the enemy because they abuse the good and just people. They blasphemed God to discourage the people; by taking away their faith and their hope for salvation)

⁴For the day of vengeance is in mine heart, and the year of my redeemed is come. (This is the cup of God's wrath; that Jesus had asked that it should pass from him, just prior to the crucifixion. That cup of God's wrath is being poured out now) see Matthew-26:39

⁵And I looked, and there was none to help; and I wondered that there was none to uphold: therefore mine own arm brought salvation unto me; and my fury, it upheld me. See Isaiah-59:16

⁶And I will tread down the people in mine anger, and make them drunk in my fury, and I will bring down their strength to the earth. (God has great patience, but eventually time runs out for the evil ones to repent. One day, it will be too late. On that day, God will deal with them just as they deserve)

⁷I will mention the lovingkindnesses of the LORD, and the praises of the LORD, according to all that the LORD hath bestowed on us, and the great goodness toward the house of Israel, which he hath bestowed on them according to his mercies, and according to the multitude of his lovingkindnesses. (Meanwhile God will reward the people who have

stayed true to Him. Those who have lived by His commandments and led just lives will be rewarded and blessed forever)

⁸For he said, Surely they are my people, children that will not lie: so he was their Saviour. (Those who teach and study God's Word; and not the traditions of men and churches; those who obey God and live by His Ten Commandments)

⁹In all their affliction he was afflicted, and the angel of his presence saved them: in his love and in his pity he redeemed them; and he bare them, and carried them all the days of old. (In all their adversity, He was not their adversary – bad translation) (his pity = his mercy – better translation)

(This verse should have been translated - Satan was their true adversary from the beginning; but they were too blinded and deceived to see it. It was Satan who caused all of their trouble; while God stayed true and merciful through all of their hard times)

¹⁰But they rebelled, and vexed his holy Spirit: therefore he was turned to be their enemy, and he fought against them. (If you abuse God's people, you become God's enemy; and He will become yours. It was your choice, not His)

Ezekiel-13 (God hates liars and false teachers - those who deceive others with mens' traditions; instead of teaching God's true Word. Those who prey on the innocent are the enemy of God)

¹¹Then he remembered the days of old, Moses, and his people, saying, Where is he that brought them up out of the sea with the shepherd of his flock? where is he that put his holy Spirit within him? (he = Israel)

¹²That led them by the right hand of Moses with his glorious arm, dividing the water before them, to make himself an everlasting name?

(It was Yahoveh <I Am That I Am> who did all of that for them. It is He who continues to bless them today; if they choose Him over the ways of the world. God takes care of His own people)

NOTE: (Christians should all know this; but many don't believe it as the truth. They call it myths and stories. They are blinded by the ways of the world. An then they wonder why their life is so hard)

¹³ That led them through the deep, as an horse in the wilderness, that they should not stumble? (God single-handedly defeated Pharaoh's army. It was the strongest army in the world at that time. He defeated them with ease, to prove to the world that there is a God in Heaven)

¹⁴ As a beast goeth down into the valley, the Spirit of the LORD caused him to rest: so didst thou lead thy people, to make thyself a glorious name. (As a beast grazes in the grass of the valley to eat and rest. The valley is where the best grazing grass is located)

¹⁵ Look down from heaven, and behold from the habitation of thy holiness and of thy glory: where is thy zeal and thy strength, the sounding of thy bowels and of thy mercies toward me? are they restrained? (They left God and brought in idolatry, atheism, Islam <today>. Then, when all their plans go awry, they ask – Where is God when we need Him?)

¹⁶ Doubtless thou art our father, though Abraham be ignorant of us, and Israel acknowledge us not: thou, O LORD, art our father, our redeemer; thy name is from everlasting. (God didn't leave us; we left Him. But, if we want to find Him and return to Him; He is right there, ready to take us back) John-10:9

¹⁷ O LORD, why hast thou made us to err from thy ways, and hardened our heart from thy fear? Return for thy servants' sake, the tribes of thine inheritance. (God never made anyone err. We err because of our ignorance)

(This is a pity party; and it's a pathetic attitude. They are trying to shift the blame to God, for the sins of the people. It won't stand. We are all responsible for our decisions and our actions)

¹⁸ The people of thy holiness have possessed it but a little while: our adversaries have trodden down thy sanctuary. (That is because Israel strayed away from God, and took in idol worship and pagan gods. In truth, Israel destroyed their own sanctuaries by taking in the false gods of the heathen peoples)

(In the end days, evil will once again possess Jerusalem; while antichrist is there. The Kenites will be there with him; as will the fallen angels. It will be a place of degradation and sin; until Messiah returns to destroy them. HE will restore Jerusalem to its former glory forever)

¹⁹ We are thine: thou never barest rule over them; they were not called by thy name. (The Kenites were never called Christians)
