King James Version (KJV) (concerning Goliath – from Septuagint)

- **144** Blessed be the LORD <u>my strength</u> which teacheth my hands to war, and my fingers to fight: (my strength = my rock- better translation) 1Samuel-17:24-51
- ² My goodness, and my fortress; my high tower, and my deliverer; my shield, and he in whom I trust; who subdueth my people under me.
- ³LORD, what is man, that thou takest knowledge of him! or the son of man, that thou makest account of him!
- 4 Man is like to vanity: his days are as a shadow that passeth away.
 (vanity= emptiness -> This refers to the flesh man)
- ⁵Bow thy heavens, O LORD, and come down: touch the mountains, and they shall smoke. (God created heaven and earth and controls both)
- ⁶Cast forth lightning, and scatter them: shoot out thine arrows, and destroy them. (Our enemies) Psalm-18:13
- 'Send thine hand from above; rid me, and deliver me out of great waters, from the hand of <u>strange</u> children; (<u>strange</u> <u>foreign</u> or <u>heathen</u>)
- ⁸ Whose mouth speaketh vanity, and their right hand is a right hand of falsehood. (They are heathen or atheists; today, muslims)
- ⁹I will sing a new song unto thee, O God: upon a psaltery and an instrument of ten strings will I sing praises unto thee. Revelation-15:3
- ¹⁰ It is he that giveth <u>salvation</u> unto kings: who delivereth David his servant from the hurtful sword. (salvation-the victory)
- ¹¹ Rid me, and deliver me from the hand of strange children, whose mouth speaketh vanity, and their right hand is a right hand of falsehood:
- ¹²That our sons may be as plants grown up in their youth; that our daughters may be as corner stones, polished after the similitude of a palace:

- ¹³ That our garners may be full, affording all manner of store: that our sheep may bring forth thousands and ten thousands in our <u>streets</u>: (streets- outside, in open fields bad translation)
- ¹⁴That our oxen may be strong to labour; that there be no breaking in, nor going out; that there be no complaining in our streets.
- ¹⁵ Happy is that people, that is in such a case: <u>NAE</u>, happy is that people, whose God is the <u>LORD</u>. (Davis is saying, true happiness is those who know the LORD) (Yea / <u>NAE</u> was added by the translators not in the manuscripts) (Happy is that people, whose God is the Lord These are David's words)

Possibly when young David fought Goliath – Per the Septuigent.
