

Isaiah 50

King James Version (KJV)

50 Thus saith the LORD, Where is the bill of your mother's divorcement, whom I have put away? or which of my creditors is it to whom I have sold you? Behold, for your iniquities have ye sold yourselves, and for your transgressions is your mother put away. (God divorced Israel, because of her idolatry. She worshipped false gods. She did it to herself)

Jeremiah-3:8 (God wrote Israel a bill of divorcement. But when Jesus came to us in the flesh, He renewed the covenant with us <the New Testament>; IF we choose to believe in Him. The choice is ours to make; but we have to make it)

²Wherefore, when I came, was there no man? when I called, was there none to answer? Is my hand shortened at all, that it cannot redeem? or have I no power to deliver? behold, at my rebuke I dry up the sea, I make the rivers a wilderness: their fish stinketh, because there is no water, and dieth for thirst. (Has God become weak? Of course He didn't. God is almighty. HE can control the forces of nature. Therefore, He can redeem whomever He wishes to redeem)

³I clothe the heavens with blackness, and I make sackcloth their covering. (These are signs of mourning)

⁴The Lord GOD hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary: he wakeneth morning by morning, he wakeneth mine ear to hear as the learned. (Through the Holy Spirit, we have eyes to see, ears to hear, and words to speak)

(This verse speaks of the ministry of Jesus that enlightens us every day. We can spread the knowledge that God gives, us to others. That is our duty as Christians)

⁵The Lord GOD hath opened mine ear, and I was not rebellious, neither turned away back. (When God spoke to me, I harkened to His Word. I listened and learned)

⁶I gave my back to the smiters, and my cheeks to them that plucked off the hair: I hid not my face from shame and spitting. (This speaks of Jesus Christ, when the Romans beat Him and crucified Him as the Lamb slain, on Passover)

NOTE: (The Romans did the crucifixion; but it was the Kenites who instigated it. They framed Jesus with false testimony, half truths and misrepresentation. God hasn't forgotten them either. They will pay the price for what they did, on judgment day)

⁷ For the Lord GOD will help me; therefore shall I not be confounded: therefore have I set my face like a flint, and I know that I shall not be ashamed. (This is a promise from Almighty God. It speaks of the Elect, who remain true to their faith in God. There is nothing to fear from the enemy. They are powerless against God)

⁸ He is near that justifieth me; who will contend with me? let us stand together: who is mine adversary? let him come near to me. (Let us stand with Jesus Christ. Who can come against us? No one can overcome God)

⁹ Behold, the Lord GOD will help me; who is he that shall condemn me? lo, they all shall wax old as a garment; the moth shall eat them up. (The enemy is as nothing; when compared to God's power and glory)

¹⁰ Who is among you that feareth the LORD, that obeyeth the voice of his servant, that walketh in darkness, and hath no light? let him trust in the name of the LORD, and stay upon his God. (Fear = revere – same word in the Hebrew)

(Jesus is the light of the world. The Elect <the faithful> will not be confounded in the darkness of antichrist's deceit and lies)

¹¹ Behold, all ye that kindle a fire, that compass yourselves about with sparks: walk in the light of your fire, and in the sparks that ye have kindled. This shall ye have of mine hand; ye shall lie down in sorrow. (Don't try to find your own salvation; to build your own fire. God is the only Savior. Be saved in the warmth of God's fire. The Holy Spirit of God is our Comforter. HE will save us)
