

Genesis 2

King James Version (KJV)

2 Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them.

² And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made.
(This seventh day became the Sabbath Day for the Israelites)

³ And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made. (This Sabbath period was the time between the 6th day creation <hunter / gatherers> to the 8th day creation of Adam and Eve. They were the first people in the genealogy that would bring forth God in the flesh – Jesus Christ, the Messiah)

⁴ These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens, (Chapter-1 was the evolutionary path that took us from spiritual bodies in the First Age to flesh bodies in the Second Age – the Creation story)

⁵ And every plant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the LORD God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was not a man to till the ground. (There were no farmers. Farmers came many tens of thousands of years after the hunter/gatherers)

⁶ But there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground.

⁷ And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul. (This is a special man. He is the first in the bloodline that will bring forth Jesus <God in the flesh>. When people have a special place in God's creation, it is because they earned that privilege during the First Age. God has no favorites. HE treats everyone equally)

(This man was not the first man on earth as most preachers teach. Man and woman were created in chapter-1 on the 6th day. There were many people of all races on the earth by the time that this man was created)

⁸And the LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed. (the man= Eth-Ha-Adam <Hebrew>; the man <and woman, Eve> that would be the beginning of Jesus' flesh family)

(The difference < man (Adam) – This man (Eth-Ha-Adam)> is obvious in the Hebrew manuscripts. Unfortunately, both words were translated man in the English translation. This confuses the reader into thinking that Adam and Eve were the first people on earth. They weren't. Cain went to the land of Nod to find a wife)

⁹And out of the ground made the LORD God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge of good and evil. (This word tree is symbolic for the form of a man. The trunk – the spine; and the limbs – arms and legs)

NOTES: (The tree of life is Jesus; the tree of the knowledge of good and evil is Satan. We are borne here in the flesh to make a choice. Do we live in the ways of God and follow Jesus; or do we live in the greed, lusts and perversions of the world and follow Satan)

(Satan is called the prince of the air. He has used his influence to pervert and corrupt this world over the millennia)

¹⁰And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and became into four heads. (This might be Mesopotamia in historical references)

¹¹The name of the first is Pison: that is it which compasseth the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold;

¹²And the gold of that land is good: there is bdellium and the onyx stone.

¹³And the name of the second river is Gihon: the same is it that compasseth the whole land of Ethiopia.

¹⁴And the name of the third river is Hiddekel: that is it which goeth toward the east of Assyria. And the fourth river is Euphrates.

¹⁵And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it. (To plant crops and to raise food; this man Adam was not a hunter & gatherer. He was a farmer & herdsman)

¹⁶ And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: (the man= Eth-Ha-Adam) (tree = ets <Hebrew> – a tree)

(eat = to partake of – better translation)

¹⁷ But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die. (tree = Atash <Hebrew> – a person – Satan in this case)

(eat = to partake of – better translation)

NOTE: (This was God's first law - Leave the devil alone. Have nothing to do with him. He will bring a spiritual death to all who side with him)

¹⁸ And the LORD God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him. (There were men and women created in chapter-1. God did not want this man Adam to take a wife from the 6th day creation – in chapter 1)

(This woman <Eve>, like the man <Adam> was chosen during the First Age to begin the family that would later bring forth Jesus – God in the flesh form)

¹⁹ And out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and brought them unto Adam to see what he would call them: and whatsoever Adam called every living creature, that was the name thereof. (Adam also domesticated animals that can be used as help on the farm; and as food for the farms and cities <livestock for herds and flocks>. People eventually went from being nomadic hunter / gatherers to farmers and city dwellers)

²⁰ And Adam gave names to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found an help meet for him. (There was no woman yet of the 8th day creation: Eth-Ha-Adam – the man Adam)

²¹ And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof; (ribs = curve - in the Hebrew manuscripts. This helix curve is what we call the DNA)

NOTE: (It was badly translated as rib, in English. Early man didn't know about DNA when the Bible was translated in 1611; but God did

because He created us. The Hebrew word in the manuscripts is definitely curve; not rib)

²² And the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man. (rib = curve - in the manuscripts; The helix curve)

²³ And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man. (She would be the mother of the family that brought us Jesus' lineage)

NOTE: (Eve is called the mother of all living – not because all people were born of her; but because through her womb would come Jesus. If you are not in Jesus Christ, you will not have eternal life in heaven, in the Third Age)

²⁴ Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh. (Their children inherit DNA from both parents. That is how they become one flesh)

NOTE: (This is the nuclear family unit that the liberals and atheists are working hard to destroy. Don't let them. Communists destroyed the family unit in countries, as soon as they took power. Without the family unit, the government can control the people)

²⁵ And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed. (These two are the beginning of the lineage of Jesus. They were created completely innocent; until Satan would later get to them)
