

Joshua 11

King James Version (KJV)

11 And it came to pass, when Jabin king of Hazor had heard those things, that he sent to Jobab king of Madon, and to the king of Shimron, and to the king of Achshaph,

²And to the kings that were on the north of the mountains, and of the plains south of Chinneroth, and in the valley, and in the borders of Dor on the west, (Chinneroth – later named Jenseret; this is where Jesus later visited during His ministry)

³And to the Canaanite on the east and on the west, and to the Amorite, and the Hittite, and the Perizzite, and the Jebusite in the mountains, and to the Hivite under Hermon in the land of Mizpeh. (Mizpeh = watchtower)

(He was gathering up all the remaining heathen Canaanite tribes that were left in the region, to unite against Israel. It won't work. No armies, regardless of their might, can stand against almighty God)

(There were still hybrid giant descendants of the fallen angels among these tribes. God sentenced them to death for this and for their other perversions. They also practiced human sacrifice of their own children by fire. That disgusted God. Their bodies died, but not their souls)

NOTE: (During the Millennium, they will have the chance to repent and learn in order to save their souls; to live with God in the eternity. Some may have already found salvation when Jesus went to them immediately following His crucifixion)

⁴And they went out, they and all their hosts with them, much people, even as the sand that is upon the sea shore in multitude, with horses and chariots very many. (Big numbers won't give them the victory against God)

(This is a lesson for the end days, when the whole would unite under the antichrist, against the Elect of God)

⁵And when all these kings were met together, they came and pitched together at the waters of Merom, to fight against Israel. (They have the high ground, a supply of water and a huge army. This gives them a clear advantage over Israel – or so they think. Israel has almighty God on their side)

⁶And the LORD said unto Joshua, Be not afraid because of them: for to morrow about this time will I deliver them up all slain before Israel: thou shalt hough their horses, and burn their chariots with fire. (God will fight this battle for Israel. Houghing their horses was done to permanently destroy their war machines; so that they can't regroup and attack again)

(One person with God makes a majority. No one can stand against God, no matter how powerful their army)

⁷So Joshua came, and all the people of war with him, against them by the waters of Merom suddenly; and they fell upon them. (The enemy wasn't prepared. God had a lot to do with that)

⁸And the LORD delivered them into the hand of Israel, who smote them, and chased them unto great Zidon, and unto Misrephothmaim, and unto the valley of Mizpeh eastward; and they smote them, until they left them none remaining. (God gave Israel the victory)

⁹And Joshua did unto them as the LORD bade him: he houghed their horses, and burnt their chariots with fire. (That was to keep them from attacking later. Chariots were the main war machines of those days)

¹⁰And Joshua at that time turned back, and took Hazor, and smote the king thereof with the sword: for Hazor beforetime was the head of all those kingdoms.

¹¹And they smote all the souls that were therein with the edge of the sword, utterly destroying them: there was not any left to breathe: and he burnt Hazor with fire. (A sword cannot kill a soul. Their bodies died but not their souls. God ended their lives in the flesh to end their perversion for having mated with the fallen angels)

NOTES: (God didn't want them to mate with Israel. Satan was using these giant hybrids to pollute the seed line that would later bring Jesus Christ – God in the flesh)

(After Jesus was crucified, he went to Paradise to preach to all souls, including these people. Many accepted Him and were saved to receive eternal life with God. HE is merciful to all of His children)

¹²And all the cities of those kings, and all the kings of them, did Joshua take, and smote them with the edge of the sword, and he utterly destroyed them, as Moses the servant of the LORD commanded. (Moses was relaying the commands from God to Israel)

¹³ But as for the cities that stood still in their strength, Israel burned none of them, save Hazor only; that did Joshua burn. (Those that behaved themselves and didn't fight were not burned down. Hazor must have been the center of this evil, so it was destroyed)

¹⁴ And all the spoil of these cities, and the cattle, the children of Israel took for a prey unto themselves; but every man they smote with the edge of the sword, until they had destroyed them, neither left they any to breathe. (They were able to move into the existing cities and farms once the enemy was dead)

¹⁵ As the LORD commanded Moses his servant, so did Moses command Joshua, and so did Joshua; he left nothing undone of all that the LORD commanded Moses. (Joshua was loyal to God; just as Moses was)

¹⁶ So Joshua took all that land, the hills, and all the south country, and all the land of Goshen, and the valley, and the plain, and the mountain of Israel, and the valley of the same; (They needed much land and many cities. There were over 2 million Israelites at the time)

¹⁷ Even from the mount Halak, that goeth up to Seir, even unto Baalgad in the valley of Lebanon under mount Hermon: and all their kings he took, and smote them, and slew them. (Baalgad - a place where the heathen tribes worshipped Baal)

¹⁸ Joshua made war a long time with all those kings.

¹⁹ There was not a city that made peace with the children of Israel, save the Hivites the inhabitants of Gibeon: all other they took in battle. (This was Joshua's big mistake. The oath was taken under false pretenses. They lied about who they were, and where they came from. Joshua should have declared his oath null and void)

NOTE: (This is where the Nethanim came from, to corrupt the worship of God, over the coming centuries. They eventually took over the priesthood of Israel from the lazy Levites. They then polluted the worship of God with their heathen traditions. God warned Moses about that, but as usual, Israel didn't obey)

²⁰ For it was of the LORD to harden their hearts, that they should come against Israel in battle, that he might destroy them utterly, and that they might have no favour, but that he might destroy them, as the LORD commanded Moses. (God destroyed them because they had bred with the fallen angels to produce giant offspring; and because they hated God. They also practiced sexual perversions and human

sacrifice of their own children. They got what they deserved) see the book of Jude

²¹ And at that time came Joshua, and cut off the Anakims from the mountains, from Hebron, from Debir, from Anab, and from all the mountains of Judah, and from all the mountains of Israel: Joshua destroyed them utterly with their cities. (Anakims = long necks – these were some of the hybrid giant descendants of the fallen angels <nafa = fallen> who mated with flesh women) see 1Corinthians-10:10

NOTE: (Akhenaten, Pharaoh of Egypt in 1351BC, was also described as one of these long necks < Anakims>; as was his son Tut. The Egyptians destroyed them all after a 17 year rule)

²² There was none of the Anakims left in the land of the children of Israel: only in Gaza, in Gath, and in Ashdod, there remained. (Gath = winepress; this is where Goliath would later come from. He also was a giant – a descendant of the fallen angels)

(King David and his men would later kill many more of these giants. Today, these are the Palestinians. They are still fighting with Israel)

See Jude, Genesis-6 (Satan sent his fallen angels to mate with flesh women. They produced giant offspring hybrids. His plan was to pollute the seed line that Jesus would later come through. God didn't allow him to succeed. HE ordered them wiped out completely)

²³ So Joshua took the whole land, according to all that the LORD said unto Moses; and Joshua gave it for an inheritance unto Israel according to their divisions by their tribes. And the land rested from war. (This was judgment from God upon the Canaanites)

The Promised Land as divided for the 12 Tribes of Israel

NOTES: (Today, we are in the final days of this Age. We are close to also going into the new Promised Land. This generation of the fig tree started in 1948 when Israel was reestablished as a nation. Jesus said – this generation will not die out until all prophecies are fulfilled) (And again, we hear rumors of aliens doing DNA experiments of UFO abductees. God is against these cross-breeding experiments. The worst part is that it is suspected that our own government is complicit in this perversion. We will be judged for this just as the Canaanites were judged)
