

Exodus 11

King James Version (KJV)

11 And the LORD said unto Moses, Yet will I bring one plague more upon Pharaoh, and upon Egypt; afterwards he will let you go hence: when he shall let you go, he shall surely thrust you out hence altogether. (Pharaoh won't just let them go. He will throw them out)

² Speak now in the ears of the people, and let every man borrow of his neighbour, and every woman of her neighbour, jewels of silver and jewels of gold. (borrow = ask – better translation) (They earned it as payment for 400 years of slavery. The Egyptians will give it to them just to get rid of them)

³ And the LORD gave the people favour in the sight of the Egyptians. Moreover the man Moses was very great in the land of Egypt, in the sight of Pharaoh's servants, and in the sight of the people. (Moses was respected by the people in the palace and by the Egyptian people in general. He had lived there for 40 years. Also, they knew that God was with Moses, because of all the plagues that had happened)

⁴ And Moses said, Thus saith the LORD, About midnight will I go out into the midst of Egypt: (He's warning the Egyptians. This will be the worst plague of all. They must choose to obey God or Pharaoh)

⁵ And all the firstborn in the land of Egypt shall die, from the first born of Pharaoh that sitteth upon his throne, even unto the firstborn of the maidservant that is behind the mill; and all the firstborn of beasts.

⁶ And there shall be a great cry throughout all the land of Egypt, such as there was none like it, nor shall be like it any more.

⁷ But against any of the children of Israel shall not a dog move his tongue, against man or beast: that ye may know how that the LORD doth put a difference between the Egyptians and Israel. (That's because the Egyptians are still idol worshippers, defying God; but the Israelites worship God)

⁸ And all these thy servants shall come down unto me, and bow down themselves unto me, saying, Get thee out, and all the people that follow thee: and after that I will go out. And he went out from Pharaoh in a great anger. (Moses has also had it with Pharaoh's lies and persecution. He is letting Pharaoh know that God has also had enough)

⁹And the LORD said unto Moses, Pharaoh shall not hearken unto you; that my wonders may be multiplied in the land of Egypt. (So that the Egyptians will know that there is a God in heaven)

¹⁰And Moses and Aaron did all these wonders before Pharaoh: and the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart, so that he would not let the children of Israel go out of his land.

NOTE: (Neither will antichrist let anyone go in the end times. He will deceive most of the world, to doom their souls to hell. Like Pharaoh, he will lose when Jesus returns as Messiah)
